# TEEN VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

## FOR TEENS IN GRADES 7-12

We are pleased to be offering multiple opportunities to earn community service hours from home! Here are some ways you can earn community service hours from home:

### ONLINE: CAPTURING NATURE

Monday, April 12, 6:00pm, Grades 5-12

Learn about how to use the iNaturalist app, how you can seek out and identify wildlife, and how the app is used to contribute to citizen science. This program will prep teens for our upcoming Bioblitz, but is also informative on its own. Teens in grades 7-12 will receive one hour of community service credit.

### ONLINE: NATURE CODING WITH PROJECT EXCEL

Tuesdays, April 13 & 20, 6:00-7:30pm, Grades 5-12

In this two-week class, you will learn to use the coding program Scratch and make an informative short animation about local birds! The clip will feature a local bird found on Long Island, and will be highlighted on our social media so the community can learn, ahead of National Audubon Day on April 26. Teens in grades 7-12 will earn three hours of community service credit for attending and submitting their animations.

### OUTDOORS: INATURALIST BIOBLITZ

Saturday, April 24, 1:00-3:00pm, Grades 7-12

Join our librarian Peter for a tour of the library property to discover wildlife. Bring a phone or camera to take photos of plants, insects, birds, mammals, and more, all to be uploaded using the iNaturalist app. Earn a variable rate of community service credit for attendance and uploading.
