# COLD SPRING HARBOR IMPROVEMENT SOCIETY

7th June 1912

Meeting of the Directors and Executive Committee of the Cold Spring Harbor Village Improvement Society

Mr. J. H. J. Stewart moved that a memorial tablet be erected inside the new building to the memory of those residents of the two school districts of Cold Spring Harbor who served in the War of the Rebellion. Motion duly seconded and carried. Mr. Stewart said that he would contribute \$50. toward this.

### COLD SPRING HARBOR IMPROVEMENT SOCIETY Report of the Library Committee

The Library has had a very successful year being well patronized by those reading in the rooms, and particularly as to the books loaned since May 1st, 1913, the number having amounted to about 3,300, thus showing a wonderful increase since 1912 when the number was 900. I would draw attention to tablet memorial which was referred by Executive Committee to Library Committee with power to proceed with collection of funds and erection of tablet.

Meeting of the Directors of the Cold Spring Harbor Village Improvement Society

A meeting of the Directors was called by the President, Mr. Robert W. de Forest, for the 28th September, 1913 at 8:15 o'clock P. M., at the Library Building On the subject of the tablet to the veterans of the War of the Rebellion, the location was discussed and position In the large room opposite the entrance was favored, but suggestions to be procured from the Architects. Mr. Holmes thought that there would be from fifty to sixty names.

#### 13th May 1914

Meeting of the Executive Committee of the Cold Spring Harbor Village Improvement Society, It was moved that the matter of the memorial tablet be referred to the Library Committee with power to proceed with the collection of funds and the erection of the tablet. Duly Seconded and carried.

Mrs. J. H. J. Stewart, Chairman of the Library Committee presented a full size sketch of the memorial tablet with approximate estimates.

It was moved seconded and carried that it be referred back to her committee with power to collect funds and erect the tablet.
