Petitions are now available for any qualified resident who is interested in a position on the Cold Spring Harbor Library Board of Trustees. The qualifications for Library Board candidates are U.S. Citizenship, 18 years of age, and residency within the Cold Spring Harbor Central School District for at least one year prior to the election. There will be an election for three 3-year terms and one 2-year term. Petitions can be obtained from the Election Clerk, Susan Tyska, Monday through Friday, 9:30am-5:00pm. Completed petitions are due Monday, March 1 by 5:00pm.
