## COLD SPRING HARBOR LIBRARY BUDGET VOTE & TRUSTEE ELECTION

On Tuesday, April 6 we will hold our annual Budget Vote and Trustee Election. The vote will take place at the Library from 9:30am to 9:00pm.

On Monday, March 15 we will hold our Budget Meeting and Meet the Candidates Night at 7:00pm via Zoom. We will post the Zoom meeting information on the Library website prior to the meeting.

We will also be sending out a budget mailer and posting that information on our website. The mailer will include a breakdown of the proposed budget and a comparison to last year's budget. The proposed budget includes a 1.90% tax levy increase, which complies with the New York State tax cap. This amounts to an average increase of under \$20 per household annually.

There were unusual costs in 2020. We maintained staff and salaries during the closure, as Library employees worked from home to provide virtual programs, participate in online chats, produce videos for Facebook and YouTube, check on patrons by phone, and coordinate online services. We also faced increased costs for cleaning supplies, PPE, and plexiglass so that the patrons and staff could all use the Library safely.

We were pleased to see that the community was able to use the Library's resources during the pandemic. Although we were unable to host in-person programs, our virtual programs have been very well attended by children, teens, and adults. Over 10,000 patrons attended programs during 2020. By reopening in June, patrons were able to borrow print materials again, and eBook usage increased by 52% in 2020 compared to the previous year.
